

The first eventful 32 hour workshop was conducted over 4 consecutive days from 20th April to 23rd April in Centre Point School, Katol Road branch. In these 4 days, the teachers explored various artful elements and deduced the essence of artfulness by practical participation clearly eliminating misconceptions of Artfulness being confined to being artistic. LEARNING THROUGH PROJECT WORK CLASS 1 - 2021-22

Class: 1A

Class Teacher: Chetna Mudliar

Project Topic : Games

The project topic for class 1A was Games. The children played various games and came to know about the advantages and basic techniques of various outdoor and indoor games. The instructors of the school Mr. Mangesh Pandit, Mr. Hemant Trivedi, Mr. Nitin Raut and Mr. Vilas Nerkar conducted expert talks on games including cricket, basketball, football, badminton and chess. Aarav Dharmik,



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class 9 student of CPS KR, who is a part of the school chess team came to supervise and guide the students while they played chess. The children interviewed their grandparents about the games

which they played as kids and spent some precious moments with them. The real fun was playing these traditional games under the supervision of Anil Lambat Sir and Ravi Medhe Sir. Making a Chess board and Snakes and Ladders board under the



guidance of Sujata Giri ma'am was like a cherry on the cake for the students. Life skills like teamwork, sharing responsibilities, helping and motivating each other, strategy building and cooperating were developed throughout the project. The students also understood that winning and losing are part and parcel of playing.

Class: 1B

Project Topic: Colours



Many likely topics were discussed for project work and the topic that was narrowed down upon by the children was 'Colours.' It was a great journey and they could unfold many new concepts. The teachers Kirti Chincholkar and Shireen Baig gave a talk explaining to the children why the sky is blue and leaves are green. Students indulged in interesting activities including Tie



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and Dye, Thread Painting, Colour mixing, Patterns with vegetable printing, Change of colour in liquids. It was a great learning experience for children.

Class: 1C

Project Topic : Newspapers

The project topic for class 1C was 'Newspapers.' The topic selected had a great impact on children as now they are aware of the features in the newspaper. They learnt article writing, how to create a cartoon column, entertainment column, Sports column and advertisement column.



Detailed research work on the invention of newspaper was done by the children. Different surveys were done to find out the commonly used newspapers. Children also shown their creative side by making different craft objects using old newspapers. Expert talk was done by Mrs. Reena Surpam who is a meteorologist from the meteorological department. She helped students to understand that the weather details printed in the newspapers are first collected in the meteorological department and then through different modes of communications sent to the media and public. This project turned out to be a great learning experience for the children who are now taking great interest in reading the different articles printed in newspapers.

Class: 1D

Class Teacher: Dipanwita Kaur Alag Project Topic: Coconut - Tree of life



The project topic for class 1D was 'Coconut- Tree of Life'. Children got to know about the different uses and benefits of Coconut. They also got to know that coconut tree is called the 'Tree of Life' as each and every part of coconut is useful. The children were given knowledge on the health and healing benefits of



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coconut water through expert talk by dietician Chanchal Sahni. Teachers including Sujata Giri, Praveen Chandewar, J.P. Mishra guided the students on making craft objects using coconut shell, why coconut tree grows near the seashore, how does water get inside coconut and why coconut is used in Pooja as well as why it is called the 'Tree of heaven'. Children prepared some amazing daily use craft objects using coconut shell. Few children also worked amazingly on coconut model. Children also prepared coconut ladoos using only 2 ingredients grated coconut and milkmaid/mithai maid which was demonstrated in class by Dipanwita Ma'am. Later they prepared delicious coconut ladoos with their family members and shared the experience of making it through paragraph writing. They were very happy and excited while preparing it. Children also prepared bird feeder using coconut shell and coconut fiber rope. They also did touch and feel activity to know the texture of coconut husk. Children were also told about the uses and benefits of cocopeat. Plants grown using cocopeat, its texture. Children were able to differentiate between the texture of coconut husk and cocopeat. The project was concluded by making 'coconut bookmark' which was guided by Sujata ma'am. It was the most enjoyable and amazing learning experience for all the students. Parents were also very happy and appreciated the efforts of all the teachers who guided the students throughout the project.

Class: 1E

Class Teacher: Shweta Pohane Project Topic: Clock - Time

The project topic for class 1E was Clock-Time. We started with a discussion about the prior knowledge and what can be done with this project topic. After the discussion we thought to start



from scratch and so initially we learnt about the history in that kids learned about how people used to tell time when there was no clock invented with the help of their shadow and then kids loved to explore different types of ancient clocks like sundial, water clock, and candle clock, hourglass. To throw light on the changes in day and night, an expert talk session was conducted by Archana Bhagchhi ma'am also we tried to make a model on rotation of the earth in our physical class. Then kids showed their team spirit by playing few timer games. They learnt about the mechanism of the clock, also they tried to make their own analog clock in the class. They learned about hours and



minutes, 24 hours clock and the world clock. Children really enjoyed their project a lot, not just because there was so much to learn from it but also as it was with full of fun and activities.

Class: 2 A

Class Teacher: Mahek Tahilramani Project Topic: Cardboard Boxes.

Cardboard Boxes: The most extraordinary ordinary thing in the world. We use them in and out. We see the corrugated cardboard in the market, on fruit boxes, courier delivery trucks, when groceries come to our houses from Amazon, Big Basket, etc. We love getting chocolates, gifts in specially designed decorative boxes. Often, we



reuse these boxes, sometimes we discard them, but there is a lot that can be done with this simple thing, and to explore that Class 2A chose Cardboard Boxes as their project. Children learned the different types of cardboard boxes available for different purposes. They explored the science behind using a variety of flutes in corrugated Boxes. They understood the importance of recycling cardboard boxes and saving Mother Earth. A number of hands-on activities were performed like folding and unfolding the boxes, stacking them, packing fragile items, writing addresses, sticking bills, etc. Their artistic skills came to the fore when they reused the boxes for Planting, making their own customized box, piggy banks, electric lanterns, puzzles, maze games, musical instruments, etc. The Expert talks;" Customized Boxes, Branding, and Packaging" were a wonderful experience for the children as along with solving the queries, the children also understood the difference between the normal grocery box and the decorative customized boxes and the difference between brands and products. The importance of three p's. gave them the insight of presenting their work neatly in other fields too like writing, art, craft activities, etc. The project encouraged science inquiry skills and mathematical skills among children. It provided opportunities for children to explore design, plan construction, and use different online tools while working. The children did research, made PowerPoint presentations, and shared their findings with peers. This enhanced team building, leadership, vocabulary, creative thinking, logical and technical skills. All this was achieved by keeping the fun quotient and enthusiasm intact till the very end. To sum it up, it was truly a magical and mesmerizing experience for both the teacher & the students.







Class: 2B

Class Teacher: Poonam Chandak

Project Topic: Brooms



Class 2 B exhibited their class project 'Brooms' virtually in front of their parents. The learning outcomes were many. They learnt about its history, invention, uses, types, unknown facts etc. Expert talk by Mr. Chetan Singh helped them to gain more knowledge about handmade natural brooms. Expert talk by Prajakta Mistri helped them to understand the science behind working of a broom, which created a curiosity among the kids. Children enjoyed generating tables from the broomsticks. Broom painting, printing and making best out of waste were enthusiastic experiences for them. The project turned out to be a great outcome of teamwork and research work.



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Class 2C

Class Teacher: Rita Bhattacharya

Project Topic – Leaves

Initially children of 2C explored many topics for their project, but finally they selected the topic 'Leaves'. With many learning outcomes, children enjoyed working together on the project in both online and offline classes. Children were excited to learn about different types of leaves, different parts of a leaf and their functions. To observe stomata under microscope was an insightful experience for them. Children had hands-on experience on making compost and they also enjoyed preparing





sanitizer using Aloe vera gel. Children have learnt different uses of leaves and the nutritional benefits of different edible leaves. During Expert Talks by Mousomee Goon ma'am, Shilpa Sule ma'am and Kirti Chincholkar ma'am children learnt about medicinal qualities of Tulsi, Neem and Mint, uses of Aloe vera, the method to prepare face mask using Aloe vera gel and the process of photosynthesis. This has further strengthened their knowledge about the topic. Children made their parents amazed by their skillful and

knowledgeable presentation on the day of the display.



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Class: 2D

Project Topic - Cotton

Class 2D, exhibited their class project cotton virtually in front of their parents. The learning outcomes were many. The students got to know a lot about cotton, the different properties of cotton, how, why and also in what ways cotton can be used. For expert talk Mr. Nilesh Bhambhawani came and spoke to the children about the textile industry and Yamini ma'am spoke about how cotton can be germinated. Children enjoyed performing the different activities in class. These included fabric printing activity, colour absorption activity, cotton toy making activity, etc. The project was a huge success because of teamwork.



Class: 3 A

Project Topic - Fire and Its Safety Measures

To develop the awareness for safe handling of fire and to inculcate such safety measures in the regular habits, children of class 3A chose "Fire and it's Safety Measures" as their project topic. The learning outcomes were many. Through different activities during the project, children learnt about its invention, causes, uses, signs, safety measures, different classes of fire etc. Expert Talk by Mr. Rajat Talukdar sir, the Marketing Executive of Fire Concepts and Kirti Chincholkar Ma'am, helped children to know about the fire safety, pyro technique (fire breathing), fire panipuri, fire paan, fire walking etc. The tour of the school gave them an added effect to what they learnt. Save Life and Property was the motto achieved as they shared their views with their parents during the Project Display. The project turned out to be a great outcome of teamwork and research work.



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Class: 3B

Project Topic - Different Dance Forms Of India



The topic taken by class 3B was "Different Dance Forms of India". The immense hard work and thorough research on the topic bore good result as the topic was very well presented by the children of class 3B. With many learning outcomes, children enjoyed working together in both online and offline modes. They learned about different dance forms of each state of India, difference between classical and folk dances, costumes, jewelry, accessories and props used in different dances. They also did a lot of research on the history, origin and significance of each dance form. Expert talk by Miss Nandini Mitthe and Mrs Swati Bhalerao further strengthen their interest and



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knowledge about the topic. Children also mesmerized the parents by their graceful moves and steps as they performed few Indian dance forms during our project display.

Class: 3C

Class Teacher: Rozina Damani

Project Topic - Pulses

Class 3C showcased their class project on topic pulses to their parents with great enthusiasm and zeal. Being at home with their parents, children wanted to take the topic related to eating and finally choose pulses as the topic for further exploration. Children enjoyed doing various activities and live demonstrations related to the topic. The learning outcomes for the project undertaken were that they could easily recognize different pulses and name them in Hindi and English.



They were very curious to know about the difference between cereals and pulses and were surprised to demonstrate that pulses after soaking were easily broken into two equal parts. After listening to the dietician and understanding the health benefits of different pulses, they were motivated to eat pulses every day in their diet. Through mapping skills, they learnt about production of pulses nationally and internationally and India being at the peak for production of pulses. The Google meet gave them the opportunity to see and ask questions on processing of pulses in a factory. It was the first project which was partially done in online and offline mode.

Class: 3D

Project Topic - Medicinal Plants

Initially, students explored many topics and they have been seeing the present situation of Covid-19. With the help of many medicinal plants and concoctions the lives of many people were saved. So the topic was decided for project work. Children wholeheartedly participated and did live

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demonstrations from home. They also helped their friends to do the same e.g.- They made aloe vera face mask, aloe vera sanitizer, stevia smoothie, mint sauces and much more. Many resource persons enlightened the students on the project topic. These included Gauri Ghatate who has a huge nursery of medicinal plants. Children could do a virtual tour of the nursery. Finally, it was full of fun as children came to know about the amazing facts about medicinal plants and started growing some medicinal plants at home. Project Topic - Non-Verbal Communication



Non-Verbal Communication [NVC] was the project topic for class 4A. They learnt about its types, expressions in nature, facial expressions, postures, body movements, etc. They explored NVC in context with animals, dance, sports and differently able too. Students were divided in groups and






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Class: 4D


Class: 2D

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


Learning Outcomes: Children understood the meaning and importance of breakfast and were also inspired to include nutritious food in their morning meal. They came to know about the benefits of



CPS, AB'S GOOD SAMARITANS LEAD THE CHANGE

The students of Centre Point School, Amravati Road Bypass had qualified to participate in the Harper Collins' Sustainable Development Goal 'Chaupal' competition by securing the 6th rank at the national level. They successfully entered the second stage of the competition. Every school had



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been assigned a partner school and a sustainable development goal out of the 17 goals stated by the United Nations. Our school in partnership with Hadas High School, Nagpur worked towards designing activities based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal number 4 which is 'Quality Education for all.' There were 20 teams selected from all over the country. Each team comprised a private school and a State Board school. In all 40 schools participated from different parts of India. Mr. Pratham Golcha was the mentor for the CPS, AB team.

The team designed a program for students living in rural India, where electricity and technology are not always available to make learning joyful. Since stories leave an everlasting effect on the young minds of students and also enhance their imagination and thinking capacity, the team designed Teaching Aids in the form of sample stories. These stories were based on the Science and Social Science concepts taught to classes 6 and 8 of the Maharashtra State Board and the CBSE schools. They figured out that the teachers could introduce the topics or concepts with a story that would ignite curiosity in the young minds and add to their joy of learning. This would increase their attendance, and ensure quality learning and retention. Stories could be told by teachers without any use of technology or monetary expenditure and could be translated into any language. This could be enhanced by puppets made from waste material. All the sample stories were written by the students and teachers of both schools in English, Hindi and Marathi with engaging illustrations.

The entire collaboration work with the partner school was done online. The final presentation was in the form of a video which was submitted on 28 Feb.'22.

The team was overwhelmed to learn that they had secured the 7^{th} All India rank in the prestigious competition.

A few days later, when the students were asked for feedback, many of them reported to have "tried the Pomodoro technique and it worked" and how the "Swiss Cheese Technique helped to study, even when not in the mood to study for too long", "after the workshop I felt that studying is not as difficult as it seems" and "now I know how to learn better and smarter".









After intensely working for three months, the story of change was submitted as a video story. CPS, Katol Road story of change qualified through the first round and has been placed as the 'DFC – UNICEF AtmaNirbhar YuWaah Social Design Challenge 2021: Top 12 Stories of Change'.

It has been awarded as the winner in the category 'Bold And Audacious Idea' And is aligned with the 'Global Sustainable Goal' of 'Gender Equality.

The selection process is rigorous, where an eminent jury of design thinkers and social entrepreneurs select the 30 most inspiring solutions of change.

It may be mentioned here that Design For Change is a highly prestigious global movement initiated more than a decade back. It believes in the power of 'I CAN' mindset of the children. DFC's new program has been working in collaboration with UNICEF & YuWaah - The AtmaNirbhar YuWaah Program. The DFC I CAN School Challenge, involves identification of a problem in your personal environment which touches your heart and eventually finding the best solution, implementation of the best solution and mapping the success of the project. The Program inculcates 21st Century Skills in young people aged 16 to 24.

The DFC, CPS, Katol Road story of change revolved around the empowerment of LGBTQ+ community, the goal of the project is to help them to lead a life of equality and dignity.

The imposing and subsequent removal of COVID related lockdown led to many challenges for the LGBTQ+ community, one of them being the loss of livelihood of the transgender community. The project was launched by conducting an initial survey followed by research by the DFC,

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volunteers of Centre Point School, Katol Road. It was soon realised that the reasons for the community's marginalisation are plenty; lockdown just worsened their status.

The solutions to the issue were addressed at multiple levels.

To achieve the goals, the steps taken up were-

- 1. During Diwali vacations, a few community members from the city were invited to school, and an open house interaction was conducted between community members, students and teachers to know each other better.
- 2. In the first week of December, twelve LGBTQ community members were invited to school, and an 'Acceptance Survey' with the target population as grade 11 students was conducted. The survey result was very encouraging as more than 95% of the young students were ready to accept the community members wholeheartedly.
- 3. As imparting vocational education and conducting skill training programmes were thought to be the most logical solution to make community members self-reliant, experts in skill development and women empowerment were invited. Motivational talks and assurance of providing employment in the industry sector based on their skill and interest were mentioned.
- 4. The community members were introduced to some contemporary vocations, such as training in computer software, art and craft. Training sessions were conducted for a good part of a week in the school premises. The paper bags created were appreciated at small grocery stores and pharmacies. The trainers were school teachers, and the DFC, student volunteers of CPS, Katol Road who assisted them.
- 5. Collaboration with the Rotary Club of Nagpur gave a bigger platform to reach out to a larger audience to break the myths and misconceptions about the TGs. An online Webinar or Talk was conducted in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Nagpur as a part of their weekly meeting. Mr Nikunj Joshi, CEO of Sarathi Trust gave the talk to sensitise Rotarians about all the tribulations with the community today.

The impact of the project has been stupendous. More in the minds and hearts of community members and the DFC team than the actual discernible results. CPSKR helped the Members to come out and express themselves in public and engage with institutions like ours. A visit by the Rotary club to the Sarathi Trust was another great accomplishment of our project. Members got jobs after talent mapping was conducted and medical equipment was provided to the members too. Three Members including Nikunj sir expressed their heartfelt gratitude through video messages. The smiles on their face brought happiness to everyone's faces.





The project for the upliftment and empowerment of the TG community by school children has been taken up for the first time in Nagpur. The response from the community members has been overwhelming. The story has been nominated for being scaled up and connected to the YuWaah cohort of solution partners based on the viability of bringing these solutions to implementation.

YuWaah and UNICEF will also be promoting the solutions offered in our story on their various social media platforms.

All participants will be receiving certificates of merit from UNICEF-YuWaah & DFC.

Under /15 Girls' Singles category, Jennifer with her grit and gumption, defeated Lilou Massart of




